Presider

Give us faith to see that death is not the end but the beginning, and may we, in quiet confidence, continue our course in this earthly pilgrimage, until we are reunited with those who have gone before and who now live with you on a yet more glorious shore. The Presentation of the Catechumen

Presider The candidate for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

The Catechumen, Parents, and Sponsors come forward. All children are invited to come forward for the Baptism.

Sponsors We present Brooks Matthew Binga to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

The Presider asks the following questions of the Sponsors and Parents.

Presider Will you be responsible for seeing that Brooks is brought up in the Christian life and faith?

Sponsors I will with God's help.

Presider Will you by your prayers and witness help him to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Sponsors I will with God's help.

The Presider addresses the Parents and Sponsors together.

Presider Do you renounce Satan and all the forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Response I renounce them.

Presider Do you renounce the evil powers of this world, which corrupt and destroy the creatures of

God?

Response I renounce them.

Presider Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Response I renounce them.

Presider Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

Response I do.

Presider Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Response I do.

Presider Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

Response I do.

The Renewal of Baptismal Vows

Presider Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support Brooks in his life in Christ?

People We will!

Presider I invite you all now, together with Brooks, who is about to be baptized, to renew the solemn

promises and vows of your own Holy Baptism. Do you believe in God the Father?

People I believe in God, the Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Presider Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the

Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will

come again to judge the living and the dead.

Presider Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the

forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Presider Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the

prayers?

People I will, with God's help.

Presider Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the

Lord?

People I will, with God's help.

Presider Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

People I will, with God's help.

Presider Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

People I will, with God's help.

Presider Will you strive for justice and peace among all people and respect the dignity of every human

being?

People I will, with God's help.

Presider Now let us pray for Brooks, who is to receive the Sacrament of new birth.

The Presider prays a concluding Collect, and the People respond, 'Amen.'

Presider Let us welcome the newly baptized.

People We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified,

proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

As a sign of our inheritance in the promise of eternal life given to all the saints, the Presider asperges the People.

The Presider prays the Proper Preface then continues.

Presider Joining with them, and giving voice to every creature under heaven, we acclaim you,

and glorify your Name, as we sing:

All sing the Sanctus (S-125 in the blue Hymnal).

All Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might.

Heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Hosanna in the highest. Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna in the highest.

All stand or kneel as the Presider recalls God's work in creation, humanity's fall away from God, and the redemption of the world by Christ.

After recalling Christ's Last Supper, the Presider and People pray:

Presider Offering to you, from the gifts you have given us, this bread and this cup, we praise

you and we bless you:

All We praise you, we bless you, we give thanks to you, and we pray to you, Lord

our God.

The Presider prays that the gifts and people may be sanctified and blessed by God. After the Presider has completed the Eucharistic Prayer the People respond in a loud voice 'AMEN.'

And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say.

All

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

The Presider breaks the consecrated Bread. A period of silence is kept.

Presider Alleluia! Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us:

People Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia!

The Presider invites the People to share in the Communion of our Lord.

All those who desire a deeper relationship with Christ are invited to come forward. The Presider will place the Bread in your hands. You may eat the Bread and drink from the common Cup, or you may leave the Bread in your hands and have the Minister dip the Bread in the Wine for you before handing it back.

Gluten-free wafers are available upon request. If you do not wish you receive for any reason, you are welcome to come forward and cross your arms for a blessing.

During Communion, Prayer Ministers are available at either end of the altar rail to pray with anyone who is in need.
