The Bishop prays that the gifts and people may be sanctified and blessed by God. After the Presider has completed the Eucharistic Prayer the People respond in a loud voice 'AMEN.'

BishopAnd now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say.AllOur Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will
be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us
our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into
temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and
the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

The Bishop breaks the consecrated Bread. A period of silence is kept.

BishopAlleluia! Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us:PeopleTherefore let us keep the feast.

The Bishop invites the People to share in the Communion of our Lord.

All those who desire a deeper relationship with Christ are invited to come forward. Please form two lines as you come up.

The Bishop or Priest will place the Bread in your hands. You may eat the Bread and drink from the common Cup immediately to the side of the Bishop or Priest, or you may leave the Bread in your hands and have the second Minister dip the Bread in the Wine for you before handing it back.

Gluten-free wafers are available upon request. If you do not wish you receive for any reason, you are welcome to come forward and cross your arms for a blessing.

During Communion, Prayer Ministers are available at either end of the altar rail to pray with anyone who is in need.
