The Psalter Psalm 107:1-3, 23-32

- 1 Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good, * and his mercy endures for ever.
- 2 Let all those whom the LORD has redeemed proclaim * that he redeemed them from the hand of the foe.
- 3 He gathered them out of the lands; * from the east and from the west, from the north and from the south.
- 23 Some went down to the sea in ships * and plied their trade in deep waters;
- 24 They beheld the works of the LORD * and his wonders in the deep.
- 25 Then he spoke, and a stormy wind arose, * which tossed high the waves of the sea.
- 26 They mounted up to the heavens and fell back to the depths; * their hearts melted because of their peril.

The Presentation and Examination

Sponsors We present Hope Catherine Avery to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

The Presider asks the following questions of the Sponsors and Parents.

Presider Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present are brought up in the Christian life and faith?

Sponsors I will with God's help.

Presider Will you by your prayers and witness help her to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Sponsors I will with God's help.

Presider Do you renounce Satan and all the forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Sponsors I renounce them.

Presider Do you renounce the evil powers of this world, which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Sponsors I renounce them.

Presider Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Sponsors I renounce them.

Presider Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

Sponsors I do

Presider Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Sponsors I do.

Presider Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

Sponsors I do.

Presider Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support Hope in her life in Christ?

The Renewal of Baptismal Vows

Presider Let us now, with Hope who is about to be baptized, renew the solemn promises of our own baptismal

covenant. Do you believe in God the Father?

People I believe in God, the Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Presider Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and

born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the

right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Presider Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins,

the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

Presider Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

People I will, with God's help.

Presider Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

People I will, with God's help.

Presider Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

People I will, with God's help.

Presider Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

People I will, with God's help.

Presider Will you strive for justice and peace among all people and respect the dignity of every human being?

People I will, with God's help.

Presider May Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given us a new birth by water and the Holy

Spirit, and bestowed upon us the forgiveness of sins, keep us in eternal life by all grace, in Christ Jesus our

Lord. Amen.

Presider Now let us pray for Hope, who is to receive the Sacrament of new birth.

The Presider prays a concluding Collect, and the People respond, Amen.'

The Baptism

The Presider gives thanks for the gift of water and prays for God to bless and sanctify it. When the prayer is concluded, the People respond, 'Amen.'

The Catechumen is baptized in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and is sealed with the oil of Chrism. The Presider prays a concluding Collect, and the People respond 'Amen.'

Presider Let us welcome the newly baptized.

People We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

The Great Thanksgiving

Eucharistic Prayer A

Presider The Lord be with you. People And also with you. Lift up your hearts. Presider People We lift them to the Lord.

Presider Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. People It is right to give our thanks and praise.

The Presider prays the Proper Preface then continues.

Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with angels and archangels and with all the company of heaven, Presider

who forever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name.

All sing the Sanctus (S-129 in the blue Hymnal).

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might. All

Heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

All stand or kneel as the Presider recalls God's work in creation, humanity's fall away from God, and the redemption of the world by Christ.

After recalling Christ's Last Supper, the Presider and People pray:

Presider Therefore we proclaim the Mystery of Faith:

A11Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

The Presider prays that the gifts and people may be sanctified and blessed by God. After the Presider has completed the Eucharistic Prayer the People respond in a loud voice 'AMEN.'

Presider And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say.

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as All

it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

The Presider breaks the consecrated Bread. A period of silence is kept.

Presider Alleluia! Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us.

People Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia! The Presider invites the People to share in the Communion.

All those who desire a deeper relationship with Christ are invited to come forward. The Presider will place the Bread in your hands. You may eat the Bread and drink from the common Cup, or you may leave the Bread in your hands and have the Minister dip the Bread in the Wine for you before handing it back.

Gluten-free wafers are available upon request. If you do not wish you receive for any reason, you are welcome to come forward and cross your arms for a blessing. During Communion, Prayer Ministers are available at either end of the altar rail to pray with anyone who is in need.
