Attention Families! Special Guided Tour of The Skä•noñh Great Law of Peace Center September 21 at 1 p.m.

The St. James' Racial Justice and Reconciliation Commission has arranged for families from St. James' and First Presbyterian Church to

participate in a guided tour of the Skä•noñh - Great Law of Peace Center, 6680 Onondaga Lake Parkway, Liverpool, on Sept. 21.

Those interested in attending will meet at St. James' at 1 p.m. to arrange carpooling. The tour is limited to 30 participants. The tour will take approximately 1 and 1/2 hours. Admission fees are: free for ages 5 and under, \$7 ages 6-10, \$8 ages 11-17, 62+ and military, and \$9 ages 18-61. The Great Law of Peace Center is a Haudenosaunee Cultural Center focused on telling the story of native peoples of Central New York through the lens of the Onondaga Nation. Topics include Creation, European Contact, The Great Law of Peace and more. The Onondagas, or People of the Hills, are the keepers of the Central Fire and are the spiritual and political center of the Haudenosaunee. The Center is nestled near the eastern shore of Onondaga Lake, a sacred place for the Haudenosaunee. It was on the shores of Onondaga Lake that the Peacemaker brought the warring Seneca, Cayuga, Onondaga, Oneida and Mohawk Nations together to make peace and form the Haudenosaunee Confederacy. **Participants must pre-register by Sept. 18 by calling the Parish Office at 315-685-7600 or register online by visiting StJamesSkan.org choosing the banner on the home page. St. James' to host Sacred Ground Dialogue Series on Race and Faith -New group begins Sept. 10 via Zoom Sacred Ground, a film- and readings-based dialogue series on race and faith, will begin at St. James Church, Skaneateles, on Sept. 10. The 12-session series will be held twice a month via Zoom from 6 to 7:30 p.m. The series is free and open to the public. **Participants should register for the series by contacting the church office at 315-685-7600 or emailing hosts Meg Osborne (mhosborne7@gmail.com) or Kathy Ploufe (kathyloufe@yahoo.com) by no later than Sept. 7.** Registered participants will receive a Zoom link via email to access the sessions. Created by the national Episcopal Church, Sacred Ground creates space for difficult but respectful and transformative dialogue on race and racism. The series invites participants to walk back through our history and reflect on family histories and stories of the original inhabitants of the land that would later become the United States. The series also explores the history of the slave trade and its aftermath, which continues to impact race relations today. Additionally, the impact of immigration and the experiences of people of Asian/Pacific ancestry and their contributions to the American story are explored. Sacred Ground holds as a guiding star the vision of Beloved Community - where all people are honored and protected and nurtured as beloved children of God, where we weep at one another's pain and seek one another's flourishing. Join us and be transformed.
