Did You Know? By Emma Cowley

Black Archives, a multimedia platform focused on celebrating the Black experience, has collaborated with Most Incredible Studio, the first Black-owned creative studio for LEGO art, to honor Black roller-skating culture. Founded in 2015 by Renata Cherlise, Black Archives is dedicated to "telling Black stories through the lens of Black memory and imagination." This focus on nostalgia inspired their latest project with Most Incredible Studio, titled How We Roll, which features a limited-edition roller skate made from LEGO bricks. Accompanied by a deep dive into the history, cultural significance, and artistry of roller skating in the Black community, this collaboration captures the rich legacy of an enduring tradition.

Safe & Warm Outreach Program at St. James'

St. James' RJRC along with other local agencies offer respite care to people who are homeless in Cayuga County. It's called Safe and Warm. The project offers safe space every Friday afternoon from 3 to 5 p.m. in the Harriet Tubman Church where people can grab a hot beverage, snacks or simply hang out. Safe and Warm also includes an outreach component in which some 150 bag lunches are prepared and delivered to families and individuals living in motels in the Auburn area. The lunches are prepared weekly at St. James'. This program depends on donations and volunteers. The weather is getting colder-these services are vital to so many people. Please consider helping in any small way you can.
