CARING CONVERSATIONS



Discuss in your home, small group, or use for personal reflections:

- What is something that brought you joy and pleasure in the past year?
- What is something you hope for in the new year?

DEVOTIONS



Read: Ecclesiastes 3:1-13.

This scripture reading recognizes that daily life includes a wide variety of events. Life is filled with experiences that are very different from one another: joy and sadness, life and death, planting and harvesting. Through it all, God is at work in ways that we cannot fully grasp. The searching mind wonders how to understand the meaning and importance of our daily activities. Instead of trying to pry open the mystery of God, Ecclesiastes recommends the simple pursuit of enjoying the day, knowing that God has created us for simple pleasures such as eating and drinking (activities often done in community) and enjoying our labors, whatever they are. As we begin a new year, we can trust that God is at work for our good pleasure and we are created to enjoy and share that good pleasure with others. For us, that is a life of faith in Christ that enjoys our calling each day to love God and neighbor.

Discuss: How have you experienced joy in your life through God's presence?

Pray: Almighty God, we give thanks for your presence in our daily lives and your gift of food, drink, and pleasure in our work through Jesus Christ, the Alpha and the Omega. Amen.

SERVICE



Jesus calls us to serve our neighbor in love. Based on the New Year's Bible Readings and theme for this day, how might you help someone find joy and pleasure in their work?

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS



The anticipation of a new year can be a reminder of how God promises to make all things new. In Revelation 21:2, this promise is filled with great love like "a bride adorned for her husband." Take a moment to reflect on 2024 and think about the year ahead. Write a list of your blessings. Pause for a moment as you look at the list.
