Did You Know? By Emma Cowley

Black Archives, a multimedia platform focused on celebrating the Black experience, has collaborated with Most Incredible Studio, the first Black-owned creative studio for LEGO art, to honor Black rollerskating culture. Founded in 2015 by Renata Cherlise, Black Archives is dedicated to "telling Black stories through the lens of Black memory and imagination." This focus on nostalgia inspired their latest project with Most Incredible Studio, titled How We Roll, which features a limited-edition roller skate made from LEGO bricks. Accompanied by a deep dive into the history, cultural significance, and artistry of roller skating in the Black community, this collaboration captures the rich legacy of an enduring tradition. St. James' Annual Meeting- February 2, 2025-11 a.m. The St. James' Episcopal Church will hold its 209th Annual Meeting on Sunday, February 2, 2025-Time 11 a.m.–Parish Hall

There will be only one worship service at 10 a.m. with the Annual Meeting directly following in the Parish Hall. Brunch available during meeting.

Voting for Vestry Candidates Begins at 11am

The State of the Parish & the 2025 Budget will be presented. Warden and Vestry positions will be voted upon.

In addition to nominations by the Nominating Committee, nominations may be made by written petition of fifteen (15) "members in good standing"*as defined by St. James' By-Laws (see below) The petition must also be signed by the Nominee. Nominations by petition shall be submitted to the Chair of the Nominating Committee (Doug Smith) at least twenty-one (21) days prior to the Annual Meeting, but not more than thirty (30) days prior. (Accordingly, the dates for submitting nominations by petition for 2025 are January 12-20.)

*Definition of Members in Good Standing:

Any member of the congregation above the age of eighteen (18) years provided that such person shall be a stated worshiper in the Church, that such person should be an active Communicant of this Parish (receives Communion at least three times per year), and that such person shall contribute to the support of this Parish (with time, talent and treasure).
