Before the Civil War, on January 1st, New Year's Day was a time of heartbreak for many enslaved people in the United States. Within the African-American community, it was often called "Hiring Day" or "Heartbreak Day," a description used by abolitionist journalist William Cooper Nell. On New Year's Eve, enslaved individuals spent the time waiting in fear of being rented out by their current masters to someone else, a practice that was both common and profitable in the antebellum South. This could lead to the separation of families and further displacement. Some enslaved people were auctioned off, while others were bound by contracts that began in January. These transactions were carried out privately among families, friends, and business contacts, with enslaved people being transferred in town squares, on courthouse steps, or even along roadsides. 209th Annual Meeting on Sunday, February 2, 2025-Time 11 a.m.–Parish Hall


